

## Mozambique

What is a Mozambique!?

The whole neighbourhood was curious, as the date for the event was promoted.

It was a totally random made up name, but has now become a buzzword in the community. It is a co-operative bazar where people trade their goods in "Mozambique currency" allowing the poorer people to pick up bargains in clothes and goods. The event attracts 100's of people.



## Sunday Church started

Last year John & Ruth began to hold regular church services at the community centre. The church called "TFR, Tabernacle Famille Royale" has grown to overflow the capacity of the building including the outside balcony, even with 2 services Sunday Morning. The plan is to move to 3 services while looking for an alternate location.

This past February a team was sent from Impact Church to visit the work in Haiti. Following an all-night drive and a near missed flight we arrived on Haitian soil



February 14 greeted by Pastor John Dieubon. Our trip was comprised of visits to 3 of Pastor John's orphanages, his school, a local school, two church services with "Family Royal", a service with our ACC work in Petit Goave, and a full on work day.

There is a scripture in Luke 14:14 that speaks about giving to those who cannot repay, indicating that you

will be repaid at the Resurrection; and Luke 5:36 the scripture commands us to be kind and merciful as our Father. This has been the response of the world to Haiti for decades due to the failure of Haiti's governments to invest in developing the country's natural and human



resources. This has contributed significantly to the country's current state of underdevelopment. Haiti has garnered \$2,422,202,996 of relief monies since the 2010 earthquake. However when surveying the conditions of Haiti today, one is hard pressed to see any lasting development.



Scripturally we (the world) have a mandate to give to the poor, however one can also find scripture to support giving to success; in particular the parable of the ten talents in Mathew 25:14-30.

Some of us are born into abundance (five talents). Others are born into scarcity (one talent). But what matters isn't what we're given — it's what we do with it that matters. So Jesus acknowledges the unfairness of life, but he also suggests that our starting conditions are irrelevant. One person earns five talents, another earns only two, but both are congratulated equally because both achieved a 100% gain.



John Dieubon and Papillon Ministries is "5 talent" ground. I believe Haiti's answer lies in its own people. Haiti needs to raise up thousands of these servant minded "5



talent" men and women who will promote a Kingdom mindset necessary for effectual transformation. We stand with John, and our ACC Haitian churches. May God cause them to make their way prosperous and become a blessing to their nation.
